Some of the services offered include: information and referral, independent living skills training, peer counseling, and advocacy.

Hello everyone,

I just want to go over a few things so you will be aware of them. One thing we have been having issues with lately is signatures. When you and your attendant sign a Signature Verification form this is how you will sign your name on the time sheets EVERYTIME. The Data Dept. compares your signature and your attendant's signatures every pay period and if they do not match we have to have a new signature page filled out. So remember, if you write your name a specific way on the signature page, be sure and write it the same way on the time sheet.

Another thing to be diligent about is your attendant's clock in and out times. It is beneficial if your attendant uses their own watch to clock in and out, especially if they work for more than one consumer. Clocks in your home may be off as much as 10 to 15 minutes, which could cause an overlap on a time sheet. If an overlap is found, OIL management staff will come to your home to complete time sheet/fraud training with you and your attendant. So, pay close attention to the time when your attendant starts work and clocks in and when they finish work and clock out.

CDS CONSUMER STEVEN FORSYTHE

My name is Steven Forsythe from Cabool, Missouri. I am 63 years old with cerebral palsy. I have lived in my own mobile home for the past 37 years.

I was the first recipient to become a consumer in the Consumer Directed Services (CDS) program 15 years ago through Ozark Independent Living O.I.L.). This program enables the consumer, like me, to remain independent and living in my own home. I hire and instruct my three attendants how to do my daily tasks. They assist me with putting on my socks, shoes and braces, plus cooking, feeding, bathing, house cleaning and laundry.

I do a weekly radio program, "Forsythe Forum", every Thursday morning from 9 to 9:30 on



KZ88.1. This program focuses on disability awareness and sports, which is the second love of mine. Also, I do disability awareness programs for schools, civic organizations and church groups. I have a speech impairment, but I don't let that deter me from trying to help others.

O.I.L. also has assisted me in getting kitchen flooring and carpet for the hallway and bathroom in my home. This helps with my safety and independence. They also assisted in lining up a plumber when my water lines broke back in January. Thanks to Ron Adkisson and O.I.L. for everything.

I have more reasonable goals for the remainder of my life to try to obtain. With the continued assistance of the CDS program, I hope to be able to achieve several of these goals.

STAY IN YOUR HOME WITH HELP!

Ozark Independent Living (OIL) and Independent In-Home Services (IIHS) offer a wide range of programs and services to help people with disabilities live independently. Two O.I.L. programs that can assist with daily living and personal care are Consumer Directed Services and Independent In-Home Services.

Consumer Directed Services (CDS) is a Medicaid funded program which allows an individual to hire an attendant of their own choice. OIL processes the payroll and handles tax issues, all inclusive so the consumer doesn't have to deal with them.

Independent In-Home Services (IIHS) can be funded by Medicaid, Veterans benefits, or private pay. In-home aides work directly for IIHS and are assigned to the individual consumer.
